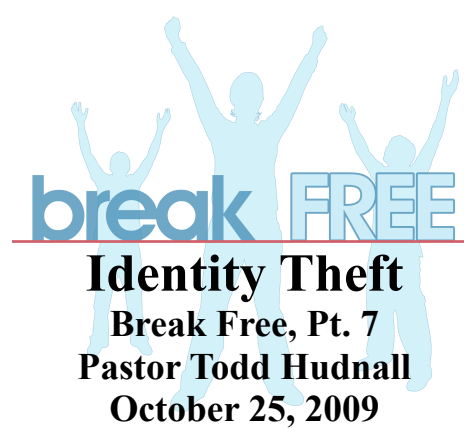


Connection Group Homework

2. Read **2 Cor. 4.2**. Have you renounced the limiting names you've been called? How did it make you feel?
3. Read **Eph. 4:31-32**. Why is it so important to forgive those who have given your limiting identity?
4. Read **Rom. 12:2**. What is the best way you've discovered for renewing your mind to your new identity in Christ? Is there an area of your life where your mind has been renewed to your new identity? How were you able to accomplish the mind renewal?
5. Read **Eph. 4:1**. What does it mean to "walk worthy"? What do we need to do in order to get our lives to align with our new identity in Christ?



Daniel 1:6-8 “Now from among those of the sons of Judah were Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah. To them the chief of the eunuchs gave names: he gave Daniel *the name* Belteshazzar; to Hananiah, Shadrach; to Mishael, Meshach; and to Azariah, Abed-Nego. But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king’s delicacies, nor with the wine which he drank; therefore he requested of the chief of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself.

Rom. 12:2 “And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what *is* that good and acceptable and perfect will of God.”

Eph. 4:1 “I, therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you to walk worthy of the calling with which you were called.”
